THINGS TO NOTE DURING YOUR VISIT:

Here is some helpful information for you during your stay. Please do not hesitate to stop by the Front Desk or call the Manager On Duty should you have any questions or need assistance. Thank you!

- ❖ **Internet** is available throughout the main building, the meeting rooms, the gym, and Kiewit Lodge via Wi-Fi. All that needs to be done is simply connect. There are no passwords necessary. Internet is available in Ted Ward Lodge via Kat-5 cords located in the desk drawer of each room. There is no internet available in the dorms/cabins.
- ❖ **Snacks** are allowed in your meeting room and in your lodge room. There is a vending area available on the first floor by the Kiewit Lodge entrance. All food brought in **must not** be temperature controlled, meaning it doesn't need heated, cooled or frozen as mandated by Nebraska Food Code. *(This includes crockpots, coffee makers and pizza delivery, etc.)* The Leadership Center staff has been authorized to dispose of any food that is in violation. *All food served by The Leadership Center will be set-up and removed by The Leadership Center staff.* This policy is not to be a difficulty to our guest, but to ensure the safety of our guests and our ability to continue to serving our guests the best way possible.

- ❖ **Alcohol** is only allowed in your meeting rooms and lodge rooms. It is not permitted in common spaces such as the lobby, dining area, pool or gym. You are responsible to follow any and all laws regarding liquor and are responsible for any and all damages, harm, accidents, etc. that may be result due to the serving and consumption of liquor. Liquor is not for sale on The Leadership Center's property nor can the staff of The Leadership Center sell, serve or handle liquor.
- ❖ **The dining room** is not a common space meeting room and is not available for groups to use outside meal times unless previously arranged. We ask you to respect this in assistance to our Chef and Kitchen staff and meal preparations. **Appropriate clothing must be worn to meals. No bathing suits or pajamas are allowed. Shoes must be worn at all times.**
- ❖ Please do not store items or sleep in the **Lobby or other common spaces** used by all guests.
- ❖ We do not allow pets on our grounds. Working dogs are allowed if properly documented.
- ❖ Our facility is a smoke-free facility. There are smoking areas outside.
- ❖ Our facilities are not equipped with guest kitchens, outdoor cooking facilities or grilling areas for guests. All are prohibited.
- ❖ We appreciate your tips and contributions; however staff can not accept them. Should you wish to give a gratuity please stop by the office to do so. All gratuities are considered tax deductible donations and you will receive appropriate paperwork. All gifts of this nature are used towards staff FUN-ctions.

Again, please do not hesitate to ask a staff member for assistance as we are more than happy to assist!

THINGS TO DO AT THE CENTER

During your visit, we invite you to enjoy the facility and grounds. There are a number of things to do:

- ❖ **The pool** is open 24 hours a day; it is available to our guests when there is not something else scheduled. The schedule for the pool is posted on the pool doors. We do not provide life guards. **Children 16 and younger must be supervised by an adult.** Please follow all of the posted rules. Also note that there is no food or beverages allowed in the pool area. There are towels available in the changing rooms. **No swimming attire is to be worn outside of the pool area.** Please shower before swimming and use warm water. Also, please do not prop any of the doors open. Please shut off the lights when you leave.

- ❖ **The gymnasium** is open 24 hours a day as well. Please shut the lights off when you leave. There are also ping pong tables that you can use. It's 50 cents a ball, from the machine located in the gym. Please do not sit on the tables nor put any food or beverages on them. Also please do not peel rubber backing off of the paddles or use them for anything other than for playing ping pong. There is a foosball table which costs 50 cents a game. Please do not prop any of the doors to the gym open.
 - ❖ There are **paddle boats** available for use. **All those who use them must wear life jackets.** Life jackets are available outside at the end of the Kiewit Lodge. Children 16 years old or younger must be supervised by an adult. Please hook the boats to the dock when you're done. We also have **catch and release fishing** in the pond area. You must provide your own equipment or fishing poles and a tackle box are available to rent. Stop by the business office or call the manager on duty for more information. Also next to the pond we have a children's playground located northwest of the dining area.
 - ❖ There are two **bonfire areas** available to our guests. Use must be reserved with the business office or the Manager on Duty. We provide the wood, fire starter and water to extinguish the fire when you are done. Should you need s'more roasting sticks, we do have them available. Just request them. When you are done with them, we ask that you leave them outside the Kitchen door. Thank you.
 - ❖ Enjoy some **horseshoes and horseshoe pits** which are located northwest of the dining area. **Sand volleyball** lots located on the south side of the recreational field. Volleyballs are in the gym. We ask when you are done with the balls that you please bring them back into the gym for other guests to enjoy. Please do not leave them outside. Thank you.
 - ❖ The fitness center is available 24 hours a day to guests 18 & older. Codes can be purchased at the business office. We provide LifeFitness machines consisting of two treadmills, two ellipticals, two bikes, free weights and a dual pulley machine. Anyone who utilize the facility accept responsibility for any and all damages, harm, accidents, etc. that may occur while in use of the fitness room, gym and pool. By using these facilities you accept these terms and release Nebraska Vocational Agricultural Foundation d/b/a The Leadership Center from any and all responsibility. We will trust there will be no misuse or wrong doing to any and all equipment.

The Leadership Center has been putting the “TLC” in hospitality for over 40 years. Owned and operated by the Nebraska Vocational Agricultural Foundation, The Leadership Center is used extensively by the Nebraska FFA for leadership training including their COLT and NPOWER conferences. When not in use by the FFA, The Leadership Center is the perfect setting for your family reunions, business meetings, conferences, banquets, seminars, swim parties and retreats. Our facility boasts a variety of meeting rooms, bunk-style dormitories, motel-style lodging as well as a swimming pool, gym and numerous other recreational activities.

The Leadership Center’s facilities include the Kiewit and Ted Ward Lodge and three dormitories, which allow us to lodge up to 400 guests. The dormitories contain twin-size bunk beds that can house 156 people. Each dormitory has six sleeping rooms with one central bathroom and are individually heated and air conditioned. Our motel-style lodges accommodate our guests in 60 rooms, each with two beds per room and a private bath.

Our campus also includes numerous meeting rooms including the Ak-Sar-Ben Lakeside room which can be used as one large meeting room or broken down in to separate meeting rooms with dividers. Blezek Hall is multipurpose building that includes meeting rooms and a gymnasium. Our Wedeking Room is perfect for small, casual meetings and includes living room furniture and a fireplace. The Jensen Board Room is the ideal setting for formal meetings with its large oval table and seating for fourteen. Mather Hall is just right for banquets, trainings and seminars, allowing us to serve up to 300 guests. The Leadership Center also has free DSL and wireless internet connections, large projection screens, projectors and more available for group use.

The Leadership Center allows groups to take a break from the world around them and retreat. Our picturesque and spacious grounds provides the perfect setting to play volleyball, softball, horseshoes or even to do a little catch and release fishing or paddle boating. There are even beautiful walking paths that lead to many of Aurora’s gorgeous parks.

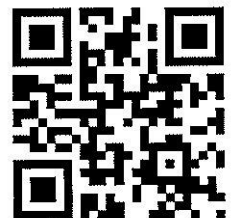

A HISTORY OF THE LEADERSHIP CENTER

- 1968** Twenty-seven acres, a swimming pool and a roller skating rink were purchased for the leadership training of the FFA and named The Nebraska Youth Leadership Development Center. Articles of Incorporation were signed by Irv Wedeking, Dr. Ted Ward and Norval McCaslin.
- 1971** First FFA camp held. Slept in Army tents.
- 1972** Two cabins were roughed in. Money was provided by Rural Rehabilitation Funds and administered by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture.
- 1973** The third cabin was built and bunk beds were bought with help from AKSARBEN.
- 1974** The Board hired Cliff Jensen as the full-time executive director.
- 1975** The roller skating rink, known as “Old White”, was remodeled. It was used as classrooms, auditorium and canteen.
- 1977** The house for the resident executive director was completed.
- 1978** A new swimming pool was completed with funds from the Rural Rehabilitation Funds which were administered by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture.
- 1979** Mather Dining Hall was built with one half of the funds from the Myrl and Bessie Mather Foundation. Dedication was held October 21.
- 1980** The night of the Grand Island tornadoes, we received seven and one-half inches of rain. Two of the basement walls washed in on “Old White”. It was condemned by the Fire Marshall and dismantled.
- The Wedeking Room was completed and dedicated August 5.
- 1982** Nebraska Hall was built to replace “Old White”. This consists of five classrooms and a large auditorium which serves as a recreational area as well. This was built with funds from many individuals, the Nebraska Bankers Association and a low interest loan from S.B.A disaster funds. Dedication was November 1.
- 1983** AKSARBEN Square enclosed the swimming pool, adding office space, a canteen and meeting space. Dedication was October 31.
- 1984** Kiewit Lodge, a twenty-eight room motel type housing unit was completed.
- 1989** Sixteen and one-half acres were purchased for future growth. A three and one-half acre pond was developed with the N.R.D providing the engineering and overseeing of the project. The pond was stocked with fish in August.
- 1990** With the help of a grant from the Frank and Alice Farr Foundation, the driveway, parking lot and service roads were paved with asphalt. Nebraska Hall was renamed in honor of Dr. Allen Blezek and dedicated October 7.

- 1991** Our name was changed to “The Leadership Center”.
- 1994** AKSARBEN Lakeside, additional meeting room space with a capacity of 400 people, along the west side of AKSARBEN Square was completed. Dedicated April 19.
- 1995** 42 X 60 Morton Building put up for equipment.
The conference room was remodeled into the board room..
- 1997** The board room was dedicated in honor of Cliff Jensen on October 5.
- 2003** Mather Hall expansion and remodeling.
- 2004** The board hired Bruce Jensen as the new Executive Director of The Leadership Center.
- 2004** Ted Ward Lodge a thirty-two motel type lodging unit was built.
- 2009** The board hired Maile Ilac Boeder as The Leadership Center’s 3rd Executive Director.
- 2009** Nebraska FFA Alumni Association raises funds with their “Raise the Roof” drive and re-roofed all three cabins.
- 2010** Through the Picnic Table Drive, over 50 Nebraska FFA Chapters donated and collaborated to purchase, assemble, stain and deliver 41 picnic tables for guests to enjoy.
- 2011** As a part of Project Paddle Boat, 25 Nebraska FFA Chapters donated funds to purchase 2 new paddleboats for guests to use.
- 2012** NVAF Board leases 3 acres of land to the Aurora Cooperative to build their corporate headquarters on.
- 2014** The Aurora Cooperative Headquarters were completed and open to public.

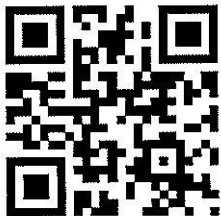
