Flights are served in 8 oz. cups and if it includes espresso, it includes 1 shot, unless noted otherwise.

The Tortise and the Hare-*Aesop*

A latte made with steamed milk, almond syrup, espresso and topped with foam topped with cinnamon. Steady, warm, and comforting- reminds you that patience wins the race.

The Fox and the Grapes- *La Fontaine*

Our brewed Blue Mountain Iced tea with blue raspberry syrup over ice. Tart and bright- playful reminder that envy changes taste.

The Crow and the Fox- *Ivan Krylov*

A latte made with breve with hazelnut and vanilla syrups and espresso and topped with foam. It is smooth and nutty- flattery has a sweet but fleeting allure.

The Monkey and the Crocodile-*Panchatantra*

A nice cup of brewed Goji Berry Bliss Tea with peach syrup. It's clever and fruity- wit saves the day in every sip.

The Miller, His Son, and the Donkey- *Lessing*

Our house lemonade with strawberry syrup over ice. It's light and straightforward- you can't please everyone, but this pleases most!

The Dog in the Manger- *La Motte-Fouque*

An Italian Soda made with seltzer water, cantaloupe syrup, and ice. It's refreshing yet possessive- a playful nudge at jealousy.

The Lion and the Mouse-*Flavius Josephus/ Aesop*

A pink lotus with coconut syrup and seltzer water over ice. A gentle yet surprising concoction- even the smallest help can make a difference.

The Little Red Hen- *Margaret Read MacDonald*

Steamed almond milk with espresso and pumpkin spice syrup topped with whipped cream. Bold, hardworking flavors- initiative is always rewarded.

The Open Window- *Saki*

A peppermint mocha made with mocha, peppermint syrup, steamed milk and espresso, topped with whipped cream. Cool, mysterious, and unexpected- appearances can deceive.

The Falcon and the Crane- *Ludovico Ariosto*

Our cold brew with toasted marshmallow and hazelnut and a splash of cream. It's bold, layered drink as sharp and clever as the falcon in flight.
