We learned so much about these books, authors and games. Trust us, we've added a few these books to our "to Be Read" list as well as adding a few of these games ot our cart! It's so cool to see how books impact and inspire so many areas of our lives.

Cyberpunk 2077: Inspired by William Gibson's William Gibson's novel "Neuromancer" Neuromancer is a cyberpunk novel released in 1984 about a group mercenary criminal who secretly work for an artificial intelligence that's trying to break free. While it is considered a bit of a difficult read, it has a cult following.

Discworld: Written by Terry Prachett. The Disc is the setting for all forty-one Discworld novels; it was influenced by world religions which feature human worlds resting on turtles, as a setting to reflect situations on Earth, in a humorous way. The Discworld is peopled mostly by the three main races of men, dwarfs and trolls.

Discworld Noir: Also inspired by Terry Prachett's Discworld with a little Sherlock Holmes thrown in for good measure!

Dune: Spice Wars: This game is inspired by The Dune Series by Frank Herbert is one of the world's best-selling science fiction series. The entire series is based on the story of Paul Atreides, whose family accepts stewardship of the planet Arrakis. While the planet is an inhospitable and sparely populated desert waste land, it's only source of mélange, or "spice", a drug that extends life and enhances mental abilities.

Call to Adventure: Stormlight Archive: This game is a based on the Stormlight Archive series by Brandon Sanderson. This series and other Sanderson books have inspired video games, board games and have been optioned for film.

Wonderland Wars: Alice in Wonderland is a children's novel from 1865 and written by Lewis Carroll. Not only has this book inspired the board game but it has heavily influenced the TV Series Lost as well as the beloved Johnny Depp movie.

Fun Facts: Both Clue & Assassin's Creed were games before inspiring books, other games ,tv shows and movies!

Lord of the Rings-Journeys of Middle Earth: Lord of the Rings Series was written by J.R.R. Tolkien in the 1930's and 40's/ It has sold over 150 million copies. These books have also resulted in a much beloved movie franchise.

Red Rising: The game is based on Pierce Brown's Red Rising Trilogy. This trilogy is a dystopian sci-fi series about a man who joins a rebellion against a color-coded society. The rights to these books have been optioned for a TV series adaptation but hasn't come to fruition yet.

Jekyll vs Hyde: Inspired by Robert Louis Stevenson's A Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde. This book was first released in London in January of 1886. This book and its story of duality has inspired many movies including a team favorite, "Fight Club". It also inspired several comics, video games and books.

Black Sonata: Based off sonnets written by William Shakespeare, specifically the identity of the mysterious Dark Lady featured throughout those sonnets. For more than four centuries, scholars have argued about her identity. This argument inspired this single player game.

Pillars of Earth: Pillars of the Earth is set during the medieval period and follows Philip of Gwynedd, the prior of Kingsbridge, and the people of the land as they struggle to survive and to build a new cathedral. It explores themes of power in the form of monarchy, feudalism, and patriarchy. Within that struggle inspires themes of revenge, often via the idea that the ends justify the means. The novel was published in 1989. It is Ken Follet's most successful novel.

Game of Thrones: Game of Thrones inspired by the first book in A song of Ice and Fire series by George RR Martin. The principal story chronicles the power struggle for the Iron Thorne Among the great Houses of Westeros following the death of King Robert in a Game of Thrones. It has inspired two hugely popular TV series, numerous novellas, and fan generated writing.
