Ken Malone is a past Ag Teacher, NVAF Board Member, and an avid TLC supporter. He donated \$5000 toward TLC operations.



The Lunch Bunch program celebrated its 7th summer serving 2,647 FREE lunches between Aurora, Marquette, and Central City and introducing 84 youth in our leadership development programs to service-based leadership. Our youth leaders plan the enrichment activities for the day. They always find that the "secret sauce" wasn't in how hard they planned, but instead simply saying "hello" to the kids and engaging in conversation - something they can do in their communities and organizations. Reminding them that relationships are not only essential, but the MOST impactful!









Working to create a privately funded program in 2025

The Lunch Bunch program is known as the "Summer Food Service Program" by the state which is government funds to bridge the free and reduced lunch program over the summer. This year, Aurora did not qualify for a traditional program and therefore we had additional constraints to comply with to receive funding. Of these, the most hindering was that meals were required to be to-go and we couldn't offer enrichment activities. For 2024, The Leadership Center sponsored almost every Wednesday meal in Aurora to offer games. To better sustain the program in its entirety, and specifically make sure we can continue to offer the community building portion every day in the summer, our goal is to privately fund the program to stay more aligned with our mission.


